WEST Refresher - What we do

Collaborate across the western regional United States to build a shared, retrospective print collection of journals.

Our objectives:

- → Preserve the scholarly print record through distributed retention commitments and targeted consolidation of journal holdings
- → Provide access to retained materials
- → Create opportunities to reallocate library space

WEST Refresher - How we do it

- <u>Analyze</u> our collective serial holdings using WEST's custom-built decision support tool, AGUA, to identity titles for retention
- **Target our effort and resources** based on risk for loss of content
- Explicitly <u>record</u> the retention in the local metadata for the titles; <u>disclose</u> what has been retained internally to WEST members and through public registries
- Provide tools for <u>local decision-making and comparison</u> against WEST-retained titles





WEST and the OCLC Shared Print Second Symbol

Report to OCC on WEST member attitudes and applications, with a recommendation for WEST action

Primary Recommendation: Moving forward, WEST libraries should disclose their commitments on their primary OCLC symbol. New WEST Guidelines and Resources



WEST Guidelines for Replacing or Transferring Archived Titles

These guidelines build on best practices outlined by national, collaborative organizations such as the Rosemont Shared Print Alliance and the Partnership for Shared Book Collections. For high-level best practices applicable across programs and formats, please visit the Partnership's site <u>here</u>.

WEST archiving institutions commit to retain archived titles through the agreed upon preservation horizon (December 31, 2035).¹ If, despite best efforts, the unintentional withdrawal of archived materials or unexpected disaster, loss, or damage occurs to retained titles, archivers are responsible for repairing or replacing damaged or lost volumes to make the archives whole again. If repair or replacement are not feasible, transferring the commitment to another WEST member may be an acceptable alternative. If it is necessary to transfer the commitment, the original archiving institution should provide physical volumes for the title to the new archiver in

AGUA Development

Background

- Regular development periods every other year to enhance existing features and add new ones
- Enhancement proposals developed by WEST project team, AGUA technical team, OCC, Archivers, and submitted by WEST membership
- Final enhancement list includes new features to support ongoing activities and to improve members' ability to leverage the WEST collaboration locally, as well as improving backend processing and validation

AGUA Development

- Surfacing historically unanalyzed collections (*completed*)
- Local discovery of WEST-archived titles (*in research*)
- Revamping back-end database to improve matching abilities
- Enhanced metadata validation (collaboration with CRL)
- Call for holdings management (*in research*)




Discovery and the WEST Collection

Where and how can members discover WEST titles now?

- WEST AGUA Reports log in to AGUA and download a full archived titles report or generate a comparison report using local holdings
- Print Archives Preservation Registry (PAPR) public registry where libraries can search shared print titles across North America
- OCLC tools FirstSearch, Connexion, Record Manager (though not in the public facing WorldCat.org)

What about local discovery?

What do we mean by local discovery? Make WEST collections visible in local systems.

What are the use cases for local discovery of WEST titles?

• Collection managers

- More immediate comparison of local collections against the WEST collection
- Librarians and library administrators
 - Ability to demonstrate that locally deaccessioned titles remain available to faculty and students
- End users (faculty, researchers, students)
 - Streamlined discovery of available collections

#### Vision

The future of print collections is shared. **Embedding shared print within the lifecycle of library collections promotes equity of access, enriches the scholarly record and increases opportunities for research and teaching.** A well-developed collaborative and interoperable infrastructure ensures we will realize the full potential of our networks and their collective collections.

#### Mission

The California Digital Library, the Center for Research Libraries, and HathiTrust are committed to shared print's integration into the scholarly ecosystem by **developing shared**, **interoperable infrastructure**. We see this collaboration as an opportunity to **shift the shared print paradigm so that the work is not tangential to the traditional collection, but fully integrated into the life-cycle of collections** (from acquisitions to discovery and resource-sharing). The work we are facilitating will be guided by our principles and centered on our assumptions.

#### **Collection Comparison Tool**

The Collection Comparison Tool allows you to upload a list of local records to generate an instant comparison with the PAPR archived titles registry.

Brief instructions:

#### http://papr.crl.edu/tools/compare

- Input file of local records must be a CSV file.
- Up to six columns of data are allowed in the input file.
  - The first two columns must be OCLC Number and ISSN, in that order. Each row must include either an OCLC Number or an ISSN, or both. If neither of these
    fields is included for an entry, it will not be able to match to any records in the PAPR database.
  - The last four columns are optional, and can be used to include data points you would like to have included in the output report (such as local bib id, holdings location, title, call number, etc.).
- Each column must have a heading.
  - Columns that are not used in the input file will be marked as "null" in the output report.
- Upload files up to 250MB (Up to 500,000 rows in a csv file with 2000 characters each row).

Upon uploading your local title list, the Collection Comparison Report is downloaded to your computer as a zip folder (please be aware: the larger the file, the longer it takes). This folder may contain one or two output files: Not Yet Committed (entries from your input file that did not match to any records in the PAPR database), and Committed Matches (entries from your input file that did match to records in the PAPR database).
